More recently, during the 2018 Ebola crisis in the trial vaccine developed by company Merck was chosen over the vaccine developed by the PLA's Academy of Military Medical Science and Chinese company Cansinobio because Merck's drug had undergone more significant testing. These two situations reflected tensions between testing and quick delivery of pharmaceuticals.

Anotherissue we have observed through this research is that there was clearly a lack of coordination between the two countries in their efforts to combat Ebola. For example, each country built its own treatment centers on its own timelimeother words, each was executing its own plans without much joint planning.
